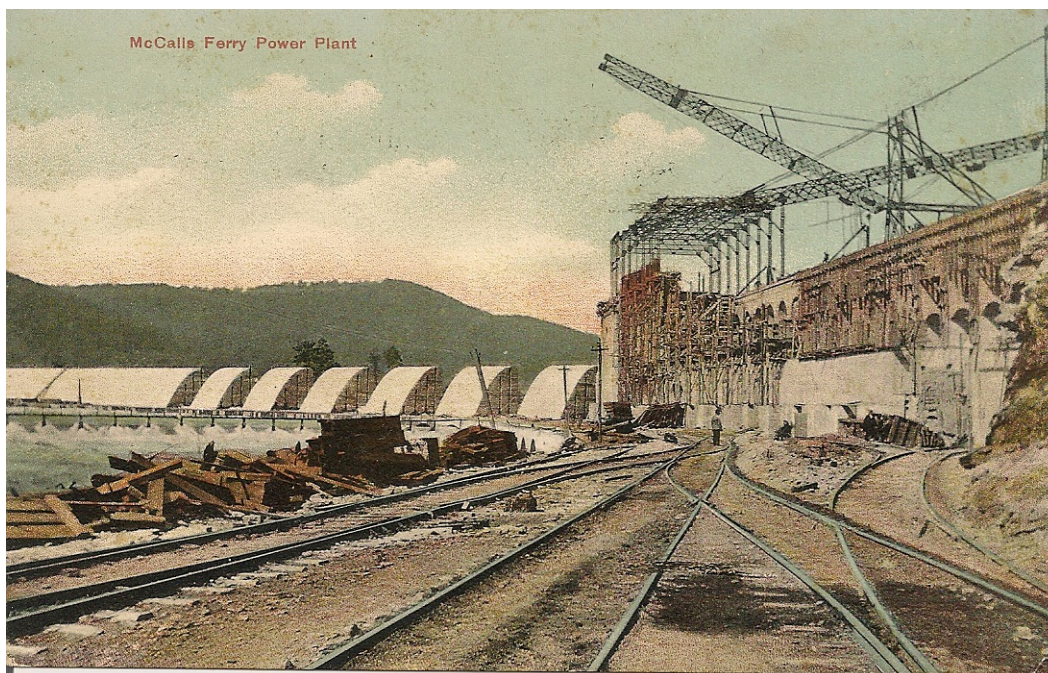

**'Construction of McCalls Ferry Hydroelectric Plant' by Mark Arbogast**

This presentation will use old postcard views to show the construction of the McCalls Ferry dam and hydroelectric plant. McCalls Ferry is now known as Holtwood. Most of the construction work was done from 1900 to 1910. The talk will include views of the area before construction, various stages of construction and the construction bridge used to get material and concrete across the almost one half mile length of the dam. We will also see the "Little Italy" area where the workers lived and the houses where employees lived. *Bring your 'significant other' or special guest at no additional charge.*
